

Pennant, Championship Events and Other Tournaments

For side competitions (as defined under the Laws of the Sport of Bowls – Rule 1.3) at Pennant, Championship Events and Other Tournaments, as specified, bowlers must be attired in the same club, state or representative, upper and Lower Body Attire in respect to image and colour. These garments are referred to as **Team Wear**.

For all other events there is no requirement for teams to be similarly attired and participants can wear a combination of Team Wear and/or Non-Team Wear, unless, as stated previously, it is outlined in the event Conditions of Play.

Refer to section "COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS - BOWLS AUSTRALIA EVENTS" for details of compulsory requirements.

MCBC Team Wear is as follows:

Upper Body Attire

• Approved MCBC club shirt.

Lower Body Attire

- Men Royal blue or white tailored trousers or shorts.
- Ladies Royal blue or white tailored skirts / skorts, trousers, or shorts.

N.B. All team members for club championship games shall be attired in the same color lower body attire.

Footwear

• Flat-soled, heel-less footwear with the design and color to be the choice of the bowler. The footwear may or may not be World Bowls / Bowls Australia approved.

Socks, white ankle, or long socks to be worn. Socks worn for pennant should bear the Bowls Australia logo.

Headwear (including caps, bucket hats, visors and knitted hats)

• Hats worn for these games should bear the Bowls Australia logo, or in the case of caps, either the BA logo, or Club Name, or both.

Social Bowls

Neat, and clean, casual attire shall be worn for all social bowls events as defined below.

Upper Body Attire

- Any upper body attire bearing the Bowls Australia logo
 - Any other shirts (including collared and collarless) shall be sleeved except
 - any Sleeveless shirts (including singlets and tank tops) approved by Bowls
 Australia and that bear the official Bowls Australia logo are permitted.
- Shirts shall not display offensive language, messages, or images.

Lower Body Attire

- Men trousers or shorts.
- Ladies skirts / skorts, trousers, or shorts.

Footwear

• Flat-soled footwear with the design and color to be the choice of the bowler.

Headwear (including caps, bucket hats, visors and knitted hats)

• Headwear permitted, however must not display offensive language, messages, or images.

Barefoot Bowls

Neat, and clean, casual attire shall be worn for all barefoot bowls events as defined below.

Upper Body Attire

- Shirts including collared and collarless, singlets and tank tops permitted.
- Shirts shall not display offensive language, messages, or images.

Lower Body Attire

- Men trousers or shorts.
- Ladies skirts / skorts, trousers, or shorts.

Footwear

- Flat-soled footwear with the design and color to be the choice of the bowler; or
- Bare feet

Headwear (including caps, bucket hats, visors and knitted hats)

 Headwear permitted, however must not display offensive language, messages, or images.

Club House

Neat, and clean, casual attire shall be worn for entry into clubhouse.

Upper Body Attire

- Shirts including collared and collarless, singlets and tank tops permitted.
- Shirts shall not display offensive language, messages, or images.

Lower Body Attire

- Men trousers or shorts.
- Ladies skirts / skorts, trousers, or shorts.

Footwear

• Footwear must be worn in club.

Headwear (including caps, bucket hats, visors and knitted hats)

• Headwear permitted, however must not display offensive language, messages, or images.



COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS - BOWLS AUSTRALIA EVENTS

Participants who gain entry into Bowls Australia sanctioned Pennant, Championship Events and Other Tournaments must have the Bowls Australia Logo on all garments worn on the green during competition.

Competitor compliance is managed by the Controlling Body in accordance with the event Conditions of Play.

Bowls Australia event Conditions of Play are available upon entry into an event or via the BA website (www.bowls.com.au) and are also prominently displayed at all events. All competitors are encouraged to refer to the Conditions of Play where further information on compliance can be attained.

Team Wear	Upper and Lower Body Attire	Compulsory
Non-Team Wear	Upper and Lower Body Attire	Compulsory
Outerwear	Jackets and rainwear	Compulsory
Socks	Please refer to the sock section for interpretation when worn with long pants and anklet socks	Compulsory unless long pants or anklets worn.
Headwear	Except hats with Club / State hat bands	Compulsory
